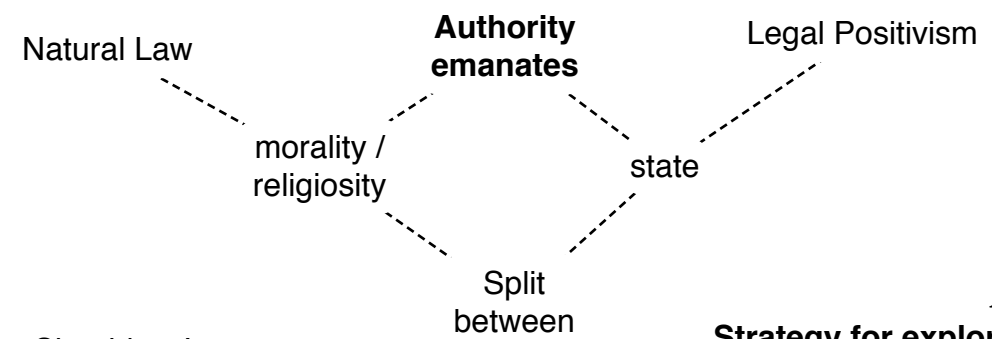


Mechanism of control ----- **Law regulates / educates / conditions our thinking**

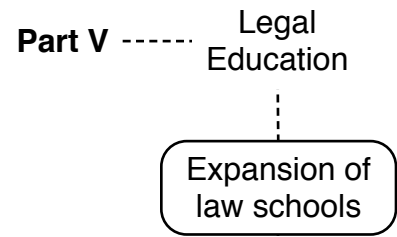
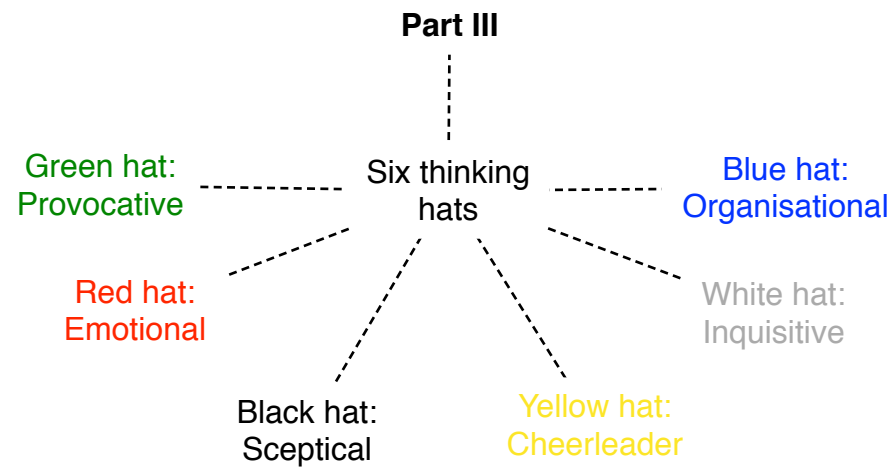


Should vs Is questions ----- Should we legalise commercial trade in organs?
